The Adult Education Program at Allegany College of Maryland is a grant-funded program through the Maryland Department of Labor and the U.S. Department of Education. The program provides educational services to Maryland residents who would like to earn the credential of a Maryland high school diploma by taking the GED test, or who may need a skills refresher for their jobs or continuing education.

Students must be at least 18 years of age and not enrolled in public school!

# **ADULT BASIC EDUCATION COURSES**

Adult Basic Education (ABE) is currently offering both in-person and online classes to allow adult learners a flexible way to engage in learning. Our course flexibility provides the opportunity for students to attend classes that fit their schedule.

Adult Basic Education (ABE) – These basic skills courses are designed to develop the reading, writing, and math abilities for individuals to perform day-to-day tasks and build skills necessary for securing a non-traditional high school diploma and employment.

**English as a Second Language (ESL)** – This course provides instruction for English language learners in the basics of reading, writing, speaking, and listening in English.

**Diploma Prep: General Education Development (GED) & External Diploma Program (NEDP)** – This course prepares students to take the official GED Test or to qualify for admission to the National External Diploma Program (NEDP).

**Workplace and Career Readiness Skills** – This course is designed to enable the student to learn the skills necessary to enter the workforce to improve employability and basic skills using the ACT Workforce Solutions Curriculum.

**ACT WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) Testing** – This course provides the foundational skills necessary for success in the workplace. Students will work through Workplace Documents, Graphic Literacy, and Applied Math courses. Students will have the ability to test and earn the NCRC.

**Family Literacy** – This course provides parents with real world reading, writing, math, and technology skills along with opportunities for career exploration to provide a strong literacy foundation for families.

**ABE Program Support Instruction** – Adult Basic Education offers instruction for eligible students to support transition into the college experience through the identification of career and education goals, developing post-secondary education learning skills and strategies, and building content knowledge.

### Work Readiness: ACT Essential Skills

While developing technical skills is crucial for on-the-job success, Essential Skills are the skills needed for work, learning and life. They provide the foundation for learning all other skills and enable people to evolve with their jobs and adapt to workplace change.

The ACT Essential Skills curriculum addresses life and employability skills and tools. It's all part of our dedication to help develop a person holistically, not just technically. Essential Skills Courses help individuals achieve foundational career readiness, as well as the confidence needed to succeed in today's workforce.

Instructional modules provide instruction in employer identified core areas for developing critical thinking skills and foundational strategies to support and develop self-regulation skills.

- Work Discipline
- Problem Solving & Critical Thinking
- Customer Service
- Financial Awareness

Participants must score 70% on each modules assessment to receive a certificate of completion to build a portfolio of career readiness skills to share with employers.

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### ACT<sup>®</sup> WorkKeys<sup>®</sup> & National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC<sup>®</sup>) Course

This course prepares the student to earn the National Career Readiness Certificate by achieving a Silver level on the WorkKeys® assessment. Students will complete a pre-test assessment to determine placement and assigned lessons in the three key content areas of Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, and Workplace Documents. The lessons are delivered via a personalized, mobile-based learning management system for a meaningful learning experience providing a customized study schedule and detailed instructional content.

Each student will be given the opportunity to complete the ACT® WorkKeys® Assessments to earn the ACT® National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC®).

Additionally, each participant will work with WIOA core partners, Maryland Job Service and Western Maryland Consortium, to explore effective resume writing, leverage access to employment and training opportunities, and become familiar with the multiple partnerships and resources aligned with WIOA and the Western Maryland Workforce System.


