<u>DISPENSARY</u>

Dispensary Technician I (DHR870) Do you have an interest in wellness, and would you enjoy providing excellent customer service in a medical dispensary? If so, you may be interested in a career in the new and rapidly growing medical cannabis industry. There are already over 100 dispensaries in Maryland, and demand for qualified Dispensary Technicians is increasing. This course is the first of two in a series and provides the training you need to work in a medical cannabis dispensary. You will learn an overview of the Dispensary Technician's role, practice professional skills and responsibilities involved in day-to-day operations, and learn Maryland regulations for dispensary operations including security, inventory management, software types, recordkeeping, and patient management from check-in to check-out, and follow-up. Class sessions are conducted in Zoom and Canvas: vou will receive links and instructions one week before the class begins. Register for both DHR 870 and DHR 871; successful completion of both classes is required to earn the Dispensary Technician certificate. 30 hours, 3.0 CEUs.

SECURITY GUARD TRAINING

The unarmed security guard in Maryland will need to be authorized according to the state's legal requirements and code 29.04.01.02. While training has always been in place, the requirement for certification is new. This training is only for unarmed methods and does not include chemical agents, handcuffing, or firearm techniques. Participants will be trained in subjects such as writing reports, dealing with the public, keeping the peace in a crowded situation, as well as working with authorities in a qualified manner. Certification is good for three years and renewal classes will be available. Additional courses to complement certification are available such as CPR and First Aid. Anyone who wishes to be licensed as an unarmed security guard, must meet, and maintain the following qualifications:

- must be at least 18 years of age
- must be a citizen or legal resident of the United States (proof needed)
- must not have any felony convictions

Candidates wanting to pursue certification will need (at a future time):

- To have an FBI style background check
- Fingerprints and 2 passport sized colored photos
- An accurately completed application form
- A nonrefundable application fee

Security Guard Training-Entrance Level (PRO400)

This training is 12 hours total classroom time, 6 hours each day. All course materials are included in the cost and optional certification available for additional fees.

DRONE

Drone Pilot Training (PRO426)

Drone PilotTraining is an 8-week course that will provide students with the skills and knowledge needed to safely and legally operate a Small Unmanned Aerial System (sUAS) commonly referred to as a drone. Further, it will provide you with the necessary information required to pass the initial Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Aeronautical Knowledge Examination and obtain an FAA sUAS Pilot's certificate. Hands-on flying will enhance your Knowledge by giving you the experience of flying a rotary-winged sUAS, which will be furnished for your use while participating in this course. This course focuses on the rules and regulations regarding the operation of the Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) operating in the National Airspace under 14 C.F.R Part 107. You will learn the responsibilities of being a Remote Pilot in Command and using the methodology of Crew Resource Management, Aeronautical Decision Making, and Risk Management to conduct safe sUAS flight operations. This course also provides the students with classes on weather reports, basic



aerodynamics, airspace use, reading aeronautical charts, airport operations, maintenance, emergency procedures, Certificate of Authorization and other pertinent information regarding the safe flight and operation of small unmanned aircraft. The course will include equal time in classroom as well as flying time outdoors and is open to anyone, regardless of skill level and recreational or commercial sUAS Piloting interest.

TRANSPORTATION

CDL Class B operators have the opportunity to drive a variety of commercial vehicles including dump trucks, delivery trucks, passenger buses, and other vehicles more than 26,000 pounds. ACM's CDL Class B program covers the theory and driving skills required under the federal Entry Level Driver Training requirements. The class provides you with training on defensive driving techniques, road safety, pre-trip inspections, and the ability to control and maneuver vehicles in varied driving



situations. Applicants must complete a screening process and have a current DOT physical card and a CDL Class B Learner's Permit with passenger endorsement and air brake.

WELDING

Shielded Metal Arc Welding (VTE711)

This 80-hour course will provide participants with a thorough, technical understanding of shielded metal arc welding, welding safety, power sources (AC and DC), electrode classifications, and electrode selection (E6010 & 7018). It also provides training to develop the skills necessary to make quality shielded metal arc welds in all positions (flat, horizontal, vertical up, and overhead) on mild 3/8 inch steel. Single and multiple passes using mild steel, low hydrogen, and iron powder electrodes will be covered. Upon successful completion, the student should be able to perform production welding, millwright work, and general maintenance welding. To certify, trainees must complete an additional 40-hour welding course in preparation for the following skills tests: fillet and groove welds done in the flat, horizontal, vertical, and overhead positions (visual inspection and AWS guided bend tests performed by an independent CWI).

Also included is instruction in how various shielding gases affect gas metal arc and gas tungsten arc welding. Welding is limited to regular thin, flat material and does not include thick plate, pipe, or other irregular shapes.
