## **Small Unmanned Aerial Systems (sUAS) Operator Certification Course**

The Titanic—one of the most captivating and widely discussed events in history—continues to fascinate over a century later. Programs will help enrich skills and knowledge in design, programming, installation, operation, maintenance and troubleshooting. These programs provide a self-paced distance education alternative to students who cannot attend the traditional college environment on a full or part-time basis.

The cornerstone of these programs is the simulation software, which is fully integrated within the learning material and bridges the gap between theoretical and practical application.
