FY2027 State of Maryland Budget

On November 11th, Maryland budget analysts presented a FY27 budget update/projection to the State's Spending Affordability Committee, along with House and Senate Committees. Although the numbers are expected to change ahead of the upcoming General Assembly Session, with more estimates anticipated in the coming weeks and months, the early projection indicates a deficit of nearly \$1.5 billion. The Department of Legislative Services fiscal and policy coordinator shared that the outlook is a lot worse for FY27 than it was at the end of the session in April. To ensure continued transparency and open communication, I will keep the ACM community updated throughout the legislative session as it relates to ACM and the budget.
