## **Budget:**

There remains significant uncertainty at both the State and County levels regarding the FY26 budget. As you may have heard, Allegany County is facing a projected revenue loss of over \$5 million from the State. Additionally, the State itself is grappling with potential budget cuts of up to \$500 million, driven in part by actions at the federal level. <u>Read more here.</u>

I am committed to transparency and will keep the ACM community informed as this situation develops. Given the potential funding shortfall, the impact will likely extend across the County and affect the agencies it supports, including ACM. I will continue to advocate for ACM at the County and State level, monitor developments, and provide updates as more information becomes available.

**Professor Emeria Recognition:** I am very pleased to share that Cherie Snyder was approved as Professor Emerita by the Board of Trustees earlier this week. This honor is earned through meritorious service and follows the approved nomination and selection process. Congratulations Cherie.

**PhageHunters:** The two phages that Biology 102/PhageHunter students annotated in Spring 2024 have been peer-reviewed and published in GenBank. They are the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> such publications. These two phages are the first two that went through the process, from discovering the phage to DNA extraction to annotation to publication.
