Budget:

I remain cautiously optimistic that the budget line item to support community colleges will remain intact. I provided testimony to the House earlier this week and will provide testimony to the Senate next week. Allegany College of Maryland is listed to receive an increase of 11.6% over FY25 in operational support. For the capital budget, \$543,000 was recommended for the Workforce Development and Training Center (CE) Renovation design phase. In addition, \$376,375 was recommended for the ACM Facilities Renewal Grant Program.

Enrollment: As of February 6th, the Spring 2025 headcount is up 0.4% over Spring 2024.

<u>Program Accreditation</u> A special thanks to our faculty and staff who work tirelessly on their program accreditation reports, visits, and compliance. In 2025, the Automotive Technology, Medical Laboratory Technology, and Occupational Therapy Assistant programs are undergoing their accreditation. Thank you Ray H., Mathew M., Stacey R., Tracie K., Stacy S., Jeff H., Alex G., Emily R., Danielle S., Elaine B., Jamie A., Lynn G., Karin S., the Program Advisory Committees for each program, and others who provide the required documentation and support as part of the accreditation process.
